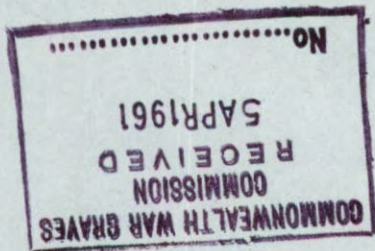

Dear Mr. Homersham,

In reply to your letter of the 28th March I write to confirm that your brother, the late 87989 Corporal D.A. Homersham, M.M., 21st Trench Mortar Battery, Royal Field Artillery, who died on the 6th October, 1916, is buried in Bull's Road Cemetery, Flers, France, Plot 3, Row K, Grave No. 10.

Flers is a village and commune in the Department of the Somme, about 9 miles north-east of Albert; and Bull's Road Cemetery is a little east of the village of Flers, on the road to Lesbœufs.

Albert would make suitable headquarters for your visit and reasonably good hotel accommodation is available there. The Commission has an office at 19 Rue Jean Guyon, Albert, where any further advice you might require would gladly be given you should you care to call.
