

Dear Bunning,

In reply to your letter of the 3rd. August, the late 7337. Lance Corporal C. R. Wonderley, M.M., 47th. Battalion, Australian Imperial Force, date of death 5th. April 1918, is commemorated by Special Memorial No. 28. erected in the Dernancourt Communal Cemetery Extension, France. Dernancourt is about two miles south of Albert, Somme, the nearest convenient centre.

The Register records that the cemetery contains 177 graves of unidentified men, but 29 officers and men are known or believed to be buried among these graves and are specially commemorated. Lance Corporal Wonderley is one of the 29.

The special memorials are placed along the southern wall of the cemetery, near the Cross of Sacrifice.
