

Dear Mrs. Baxter,

I have received your letter dated 22nd June, which it is thought must refer to the late Driver J. Lindley, 8,6251, Royal Field Artillery, who lost his life on 5th December 1917, and who was the son of James and Isabella Lindley, of Maltby, Yorkshire.

This soldier is buried in Rocquigny-Equancourt Road British Cemetery, France, and the particulars of his grave are Plot 5, Row E, Grave 4. Rocquigny and Equancourt are villages, 5 miles and 9 miles respectively south-east of the small town of Bapaume, the latter being 4 miles south of Arras. The cemetery concerned is a mile west-north-west of Equancourt on the road towards Rocquigny. It is open at all times and a register, containing a plan, is available on the spot.
