Dear Mr. Thompson,

Thank you for your letter of the 24th August about the enquiry you have received from the relatives of 695 Corporal David John Gunn, 29th Bn. Australian Infantry, date of death 8th May, 1918.

I confirm that this soldier is buried in Corbie Communal Cemetery Extension, France, Plot 2, Row D, Grave No. 77. The Extension is east of the Communal Cemetery, 9 miles east of Amiens and one mile from Corbie railway station, north of the town between the roads to Vaux and Bray.

Corbie railway station is on the main line from Calais and Dunkirk to Arras and Paris, and it lies between Arras and Amiens.
