Dear Colonel Leggatt,

With reference to your letter CD:JC 6116 of 27th April, Private H.E. Trembath, 5918, 22nd Battalion Australian Infantry is buried in Peronne Communal Cemetery Extension, Plot 5, Row A, Grave 2.

Peronne, as perhaps your enquirer knows is a town in the Department of the Somme, France, about 30 miles ^{east} west of Amiens. The Communal Cemetery and its extension of war graves is in the north-western outskirts of the town near the road which leads from the west end of the town to the village of Mont-St. Quentin. Plot 5 of the extension is on the right hand side of the path from the entrance to the "Cross of Sacrifice" and extends from about half way along the path as far as the Cross. Row A is the one nearest the path.
