Dear Madam,

In reply to your letter of the 23rd. February, the grave of 6374 Private Colin McCulloch, 8th. Bn. Australian Infantry, date of death 9th. August 1918, is in Rosieres Communal Cemetery Extension, France, Plot II., Row B., Grave No.5.

It is noted that in your letter you refer to the rank as Corporal and the Unit as Artillery, but our records give the details set out above.

The Register records that Private McCulloch was the son of Samuel and Elizabeth McCulloch and the husband of Ruby F. McCulloch, of Avoca, Victoria, Australia, and that he was born at Skaith, Newton Stewart, Scotland.

Rosieres is about 21 miles east of Amiens, and the Communal Cemetery Extension is about one mile from the station at Rosieres and near the road leading to Caix.
