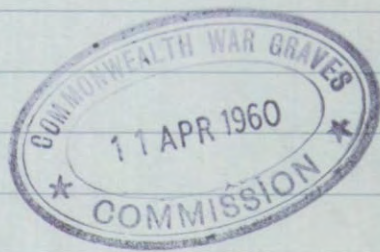
Dear sir,

Dear Mrs. Norris,

In answer to your letter of 8th April, I can confirm that Driver R.C. Fielding, 745887, Royal Field Artillery, is buried in Dozinghem Military Cemetery, Belgium. The particulars of his grave are Plot 11, Row A, Grave 16.

This cemetery is 3 miles north-north-west of the town of Poperinghe and $\frac{1}{2}$ mile east of the road from Poperinghe to Crombeke. It is open at all times. To locate any particular grave one can consult the register, which contains a plan and is available in the register box, or one can ask one of the gardeners for assistance.

I trust this gives all the information you require.
