Dear Mrs. Chiveralls,

I am sorry that it should be necessary to write to you about the grave of the late Officers Steward 2nd Class W. F. Chiveralls, Royal Navy, but the Commission's first concern is to ensure that the graves of those who gave their lives in the 1914-1918 and the 1939-1945 Wars are adequately maintained.

For some time past the Commission have felt uneasy about the condition of the war graves in outlying parts of the Scandinavian countries where the difficulty of access and the distance of the cemeteries from the responsible administrative headquarters render the task of supervision well-nigh impossible.

After careful consideration of all the circumstances, the Commission have reluctantly decided that owing to the remoteness of your husband's burial place in Sandbogen Cemetery, Kungsham, Sweden and the extreme difficulty of arranging for its periodic inspection and essential renovation the war graves in this cemetery shall be transferred to the new Commonwealth Plot in Kvilberg Cemetery, Gøteborg, where their upkeep to the standard that relatives are entitled to expect can be assured.

Gøteborg is a coastal town on the south-western seaboard of Sweden.

The transfer will be carried out with care and reverence by the Commission's experienced staff, and when the work has been completed you will be advised of the new grave location.

Dear Mrs. Chiveralls,

You will no doubt recall that on the 2nd March, 1961, the Commission wrote to inform you that because of the difficulty in maintaining the war graves in certain outlying parts of the Scandinavian countries, it had been decided that the graves in some of the more inaccessible places should be concentrated to a few central cemeteries.

I am now writing to let you know that the grave of Officers Steward 2nd Class W.F. Chiveralls, Royal Navy, has been moved with care and reverence into Kviberg Cemetery, and the new location of the grave is Plot 1, Row A, Grave No.7.

I regret that the title of this cemetery was incorrectly spelt in the Commission's previous letter under reference.

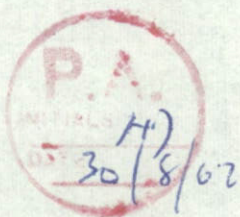
